Stolen Vehicle Recovered After Pursuit

On Tuesday, October 29, 2013, at approximately 0140, Warren County Deputies Andrew Grossenbaugh and Kennon Coleman attempted to stop a stolen Honda CRV with Ohio registration FQJ-1840. They initially observed the stolen vehicle traveling south on Interstate 75 near the 36 mile post, in Franklin Township.

The operator of the stolen vehicle ignored the overhead cruiser lights and sirens of the patrol cars and a vehicle pursuit ensued, where top speeds didn't exceed 80 mph.

The pursuit continued south on Interstate 75 to S.R. 63, where the stolen vehicle proceeded west into Monroe. The pursuit continued through Monroe and eventually back into Warren County, where it ended in the Thorny Acres subdivision, in Franklin Township.

The stolen vehicle was occupied by five males and all fled the vehicle on foot after coming to a dead end residential street. The Deputies with the assistance of Officers from the Middletown and Monroe Police Departments were able to apprehend four of the five shortly thereafter.

The following individuals were charged:

Deontay Roberson, Age 20, Driver (Failure to Comply, Resisting Arrest, Receiving Stolen Property, Possession of Drugs, Improper Handling of a Firearm)

Michael Roberson, Age 18 (Obstructing Official Business, Resisting Arrest)

The other two apprehended individuals are juveniles and were charged and incarcerated. The fifth occupant was not apprehended or identified at this point.

It was determined the vehicle was stolen the previous evening in the city of Kettering, Ohio. Detectives from the Kettering Police Department interviewed the apprehended suspects and have charged Deontay Roberson and one of the juveniles for offenses committed in their jurisdiction, in addition to the charges they face in Warren County.
