Sheriff Larry Sims and Lebanon Police Chief Jeff Mitchell, as well as canine deputies Axel and Kash and officer Kaiser, will accept the vests today from Dr. Coleman at the Sheriff's Office. The short ceremony will begin at 1 PM. Members of the media are invited. There will be plenty of opportunity to photograph the dogs and their handlers.
